1. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 구입할 화분을 고르시오.

- M: Hello. May I help you, ma'am?
- W: Yes. I'm looking for a potted plant as a housewarming gift.
- M: Did you have anything in mind?
- W: I was thinking about buying an ivy plant that can hang in the balcony.
- M: Okay. We have the hanging ivy plant in two kinds of pots, a triangle-shaped one and a square-shaped one.
- W: Hmm.... It's hard to choose. They're both nice.
- M: Well, the square-shaped one can also be put on the table, but the triangle-shaped one is more stylish.
- W: I like the triangle-shaped one better.
- M: Then, we have one with stripes and one without stripes.
- W: I'll take the striped one. Could I have it wrapped?
- M: Of course. It'll only take a minute.
